Summary of occasions to glorify God illustrated in the Bible:

- The faithful works of others (generosity, obedience, and conversion)
- Forgiveness
- Witnessing miracles
- Experiencing miracles
- Reigning over death
- Gospel for all
- Gospel spreading
- Mercy of God
- Accepting one another
- Morality
- We glorify God through our own lives and deaths

Literally, to glorify God is to parade God’s character traits to others.

Moses asked to see God’s glory (33:18). God promised to show Moses His goodness, authority, grace, and compassion (33:19). When the event occurred, God proclaimed His compassion, grace, patience, lovingkindness, faithfulness, forgiveness, and justice (34:6 – 7). When we see a manifestation of the character of God, we should announce it to others.
